tion of Its Court Will Be Upheld.

Vancouver, B. C., Nov. 19.-The full court will immediately hear arguments on the appeal which the Attorney-General has entered against Justice McClement's decision that the British Columbia courts never had jurisdiction in divorce cases. While the Government is confident that the decision will be reversed, divorce legislation will be one of the subjects to be taken up at the next session at Victoria, as it is the Government's inention to create a special divorce court as in England, jurisdiction having always been exercised in British Columbia by all the supreme court judges at the various civil sittings of that court. Meanwhile, if the full court should agree that the province has not and never had jurisdiction, the Government will ask Ottawa to legalize all the divorces that have been granted, as well as the remarriage of

divorced persons. Victoria, unlike Ottawa, takes the natter seriously. The dispatch, supposed to represent the opinion of the department of justice, is about 3,000 miles away from the point. It states confederation expressy stated that British Columbia should retain all its laws and courts existing at the time of the union, and so would retain its right then exercised to grant divorce, but the real point is, did British Columbia ever have a diverce law, or more technically, did the proclamation of Sir James Douglas, adapting the English law and courts to British Columbia, include the special divorce court of England. The act of union really has no bearing on the
