

H. Coursey Takes M.A.A. Individual Championships With Total of 39 Points

WINS THREE SPRINT EVENTS AND STANDING BROAD JUMP

Harry Coursey proved the sensation of the Manufacturers' track meet Saturday when he showed his heels to Perrin Gorman in both the 100 and 220, won the 440 and by way of showing versatility took first in the standing broad jump. He won the individual championship of the M.A.A. by winning over half the number of points needed to give the McCormick Manufacturing Company track team the team championship and the Western Fair board's silver cup.

Captain Coursey, Canada's Olympic coach, was an interested spectator of the events, which attracted a smaller crowd than usual, and he was surprised as the rest of the gallery when Coursey led Gorman by yards in both the sprints. Gorman was obviously not in the form he showed on his return from the training camp, but nevertheless took nothing away from the impressiveness of the colored boy's wins. Doug Westman also got two firsts in the 100 and 220, step and jump to make McCormick's lead still more secure and Miss Foote, runner-up in the ladies' individual point total, also contributed her share. The McCormick team topped a big day by taking the relay race.

Goes Through Fast.
The program justified its variety, and although there were nervous moments in the sprints, the bill went through fairly fast.

The girls' sprint teams' relay race proved one of the features. The win of the Arrows was not expected by the crowd, as they were much smaller girls than the others, but they gained many yards by having been coached in picking up the baton.

Walter Dutton, who carried off several of the individual championships in pre-war days. He took the running broad and 120-yard hurdles handsomely enough.

The bike events proved a big attraction. Gerald Davis took the feature pedalling event, the five-mile open, in 13:08 against a good field.
