He moved that the question as to the chairmanship be referred to the city solicitor. "Who will put the resolution?" was a question that immediately suggested itself to the other members. Both of the contestants agreed that Mr. Vokes' proposition was an equitable and sensible one, but neither would relinquish the right to discharge the functions of chairman, because such a concession by either might be construed into a recognition of the other's claim. And so the matter stands.


