resident Gompers Says the Master Work man is a Labor Agent. New York, June 23.—General Master Workman Powderly's attack on President Gompers and the American Federation of Labor at the Knights of Labor Cooper Union mass-meeting is generally considered as the forerunner of a struggle between the two organizations that is likely to result to the disadvantage of both, Conservative men on both sides deplore the controversy and hope that the dispute may yet be amicably settled. President Tompers, however, is up in arms, and, if anything, is even more aggressive than Mr. Powderly. President Gompers was seen at the headquarters of the American Federation to-day. He anamersted a number of instances where the officers of the Knights of Labor had filled the places of striking cigarimakers, printers and iron and steel workers with "scabe."

President Gompers said: "I charge the officers of the Knights of Labor with being cheap and servile labor agents, and that they have made the Knights of Labor organization the same to the labor invariant in general that the Printers Protective Fraternity, which is organized to furnish scallabor, is to the International Typographical Union. General Master Workman Powderly instinuates that I am a cur and a coward. If he heligiered that save did to make it in the content of the cont NEW YORK, June 23,-General Maste does he not accept my proposition to meet him in the future? I will meet him on or off the platform in any way that will satisfy his overweening conceit and stamp him once for all as a charletan and an incubus upon the labor movement."


