DEATH WAS INSTANTANEOUS

NEILL, THE MURDERER, WAS COOL TO THE LAST.

A Large and Curious Crowd Were Outside the Prison and Executions Were General as the Black Flag Was Run Up—The Woman Poisoner Made No Confession.

LONDON, Nov. 16.—Thomas Neill, otherwise known as the "Red Head," was executed by hanging at the gallows at the prison at Pentonville, London, at 11 o'clock yesterday morning.

At three minutes to 9 o'clock, accompanied by an assistant who carried the pincers, Neill was taken to the cell of the condemned man, where he found the prison chaplain ministering to Neill.

Without a moment's delay the hangman, while courteously asking the permission of the condemned man, passed a broad belt around his waist and secured his elbows with two straps tightly drawn back and fastened to the belt.

Straps were placed around his wrists and connected with the body belt in front. This rendered Neill absolutely incapable of moving his arms or hands.

The condemned man did not utter a word during the process, which lasted barely a minute. The procession to the gallows was then formed. It was headed by the chief warder, who was followed by the chaplain, who, as he walked, read the burial service.

Neill came next, guarded on each side. He walked firmly, a deadly pallor over his face, but his face showed no other traces of emotion.

Closed behind the prisoner walked the hangman, who passed through the corridors toward the scaffold, the tolling of the passing bell of St. Sepulchre's, which marked the last moments of so many criminals, resounded through the prison.

Death was instantaneous. On arriving at the scaffold, the white cap, which had been previously placed upon the head of the condemned man, was pulled down over his eyes.

These took only a few minutes. His legs were pinioned with a strap that was fastened to the scaffold and his arms were fastened to the cross beam.

DIDN'T KNOW HER HUSBAND.

A FUNNY CASE OF ALLEGED BIGAMY AT PICTON.

A Woman Who Was Handly Mixed Over the Identity of a Man She Married Six Years Ago—She Got Mad the First Year and Drowned in the Sea.

BELETTVILLE, Nov. 15.—At Picton yesterday a case of alleged bigamy was tried. The complainant, Jane Comp, testified that she married T. A. Sturges six years ago in the presence of several witnesses.

Sturges was married again on the 10th inst. to Miss Bristow by Rev. Mr. Loucks. Mr. Loucks proved the second marriage and identified the parties.

MacBongard corroborated being present at the wedding of a man named Sturges and a girl named Comp at Lindsay's about six years ago. He recognized the wife, but not the prisoner.

The county attorney put in the parish register, which showed that Sturges was married to Jane Comp in May, 1888. Alexander Lindsay surprised the assembly by availing that the prisoner was not the man at all. He was a uncle of Sturges and knew him well. It was Albert Sturges, a brother of Thomas Sturges, who had been married at his place and not this man as all. Albert went to Michigan two or three years ago.
