More Wheat-Less Labor

The growing of wheat produces much more important food for each hour of man-labor put upon it, than When do either potatoes or corn. wheat yields 30 bushels to the acre, reliable figures show that one hour of man labor produces 1 2-3 bushels of wheat. At prevailing yields one hour of man-labor on potatoes produces about a bushel of that crop, while on corn one hour of man-labor produces about $1\frac{1}{4}$ bushels. It is obviously a matter of labor economy wheat writes Henry G. Bell B. S. A. who adds: By giving proper attention to all the factors which enter into successful wheat growing much larger yields can be produced. This has been established, times without number by efficient wheat growers of Europe. The average man is disposed to say that Europe had until lately an abundance of cheap labor, which fact in itself accounts for the 30 bushels of wheat peracre which Great Britain harvests, as compared with the 18 to 20 bushels per acre which are gathered in Canada. Cheap labor has its counterpart in our highly efficient farm machinery. By adding a horse to the team and by, using wider etc., it is possible to reduce the manlabor required in raising wheat from 50 to 75 per cent. This is America's answer to European abundant and cheap labor.

skins Pack the tomatoes whole in jars, doing one jar from the beginning to placing in sterilizer before starting on another. Shake down well, hitting the base of the jar with palm of hand and also press with a tablespoon to avoid crushing.


Do not add water. Hot tomato pulp may be added, otherwise add no liquid whatever. Tomatoes are an exception to the general rule of hot water for vegetables and hot water or hot syrups for fruits. A large part of the tomato is water. It is not necessary to add anything but one level teaspoonfull of salt to each quart and if liked one-half teaspoonfull of sugar. The tomato pulp for home canning made from large and broken tomatoes cooked and strained should have one teaspoonful of salt to each quart, and should be poured hot into the filled jars, allowing it to enter the spaces.

Put on rubber and top, adjust top bail or screw top on with thumb and little finger. Sterilize 22 minutes in hot water bath, or 16 minutes under five or ten pounds'of steam pressure. Remove, tighten. seal and cool.
