PRODUCTS OF COAL TAR

Coal tar, one of the products of soft or bituminous coal, resulting from the manufacture of coke and illuminating gas, was formerly regarded as of very little value. It was used for covering paper and preserving wood, but comparatively little of the total quantity produced was required for these purposes, and the balance was chiefly treated as refuse.
