of a magnifying Glass, seem to be round and articulated, as if they were Seed-Vessels; besides these, there are other broad Leaves, chiefly at the extremity of the Branches, serrated on the edges. The vesiculæ are round, of the bigness express'd in the Figure.

Tab. 5. Fig. 2. Fucus ex Nova Guinea Fluviatilis Pisanæ J. B. foliis. Plants are fo apt to vary in their Leaves, according to their different States, that 'tis hard to fay this is distinct from the last. It has in several Places (not all express'd in the Figure) some of the small short Leaves, or Seed-Vessels mention'd in the former; which makes me apt to believe it the same, gather'd in a different State; befides the broad Leaves of that and this agree as to their Shape and Indentures.
