Sheep for exportation.—Mr. Hall, of Liverpool, says on this point: Large numbers of Canadian sheep pass through my hands. They do not rank well on the English market. The reason is that most of them are rams, and old, sucked out ewes. Some of them you can get fat, but they won't take on much flesh, and the consequence is that they are light on the loin, and mutton of that sort does not sell well. A thing you ought to implore your farmers to do is to eastrate their ram lambs. When they are four or five months

old they begin to run after the ewes, their flesh becomes tough, coarse, and strong-flavoured. If you sent over a mixed shipload of sheep, and at the same time sent a thousand well selected wethers, there would be, I think, a difference of \$2.50 a head in favour of the wethers, and you would have twenty buyers for them where you would have one for the others—all the best buyers would be after your sheep. Ont. Ag. Commission.


