Montreal Stock Market.

DULLNESS PREVAILS - C. P. R. STRONG -- DOMINION COTTON STILL ADVANCING-WAR EAGLE 311.

The week opened with lower quo-tations and weaker cables from Lon-don, but prices on the whole were well maintaided, although the mark-et itself was not active but rather in-clined to dullness. London sold heavily in the New York Exchange, and prices in the first hour were con-siderably below last Saturday's clos-ing although at this point there was ing, although at this point there was strong support given and the market quickly rallied, the Grangers being especially strong and active.

There were rumors of Canadian There were rumors of Canadian Pacific doing much better, and ad-vices came from New York to pur-chase some. In our market C.P.R. was decidedly strong, and although the actual gain was in no way start-ling, yet the undertone was good and we look for higher prices in this stock. Some 2,178 shares were sold, the price being well held and closing at 86% with none offering ander 864.

at 86% with none offering ander 86%. Dominion Cotton was also well to the front, it acted decidedly strong and closes at the top price at almost a point's advance from Saturday's closing. We should not be at all sur-prised, as was stated in Saturday's "Exchange News," to see this stock sell at still higher prices. War Early accoursed some of its

War Eagle recovered some of its loss selling at 313, realizing in the above seems to be over for the pre-sent. Montreal Gas was also a shade better selling at 213, and Montreal Telegraph was steady at 173.

In other stocks there was no great demand to buy. Toronto Ry, ruled steady for a few sales, and so did Electric, some 250 shares of the for-mer selling at 108¹/₄ and 125 of the latter sold at 163.
