

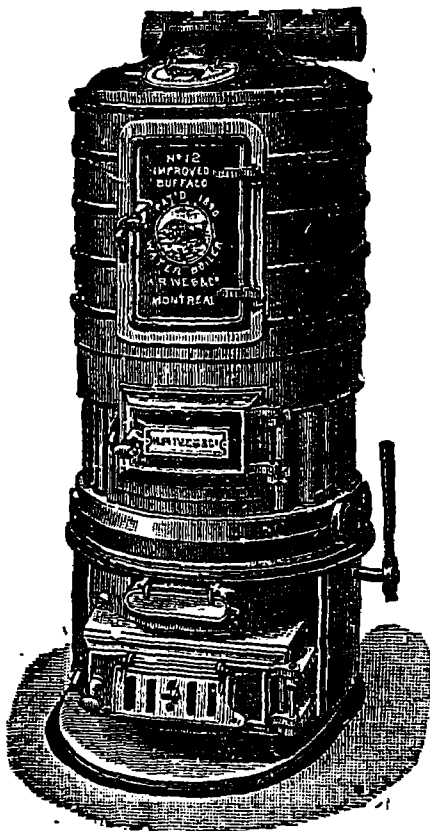

The list of winning numbers is sent to each subscriber.

Those who acquire paintings from the Society can, within a delay of three months from the date of such acquisition, exchange them for others of an equal value that are disposable. Again, within the same delay, if for one reason or another they wish to dispose of them, they can sell them back to the Society. In the latter case, however, the Society does not bind itself to pay for such more than 50 per cent of the price mentioned in the catalogues or marked upon the work itself. For instance, it will pay \$50 for a painting marked down at \$100.
