The twenty-second annual report of the above society—the largest trade society in the world-has just been prepared and issued by Mr. W. Allan, the general secretary, and shows the extraordinary progress made by the society since its establishment in 1852, after the failure of the struggle in that year between the then existing local engineers' societies and their employers. The figures in this report show that the society started with 7,000 members in 1852, and at the end of 1872, to which date the report is brought up, there were 41,075 members, 5,294 having joined during the past year. The total income of the society for 1872 amounted to £105,373 14s. bd., and the balance in hand from previous years was £116,326 6s. 7d., making a grand total for the year of £221,704 1s. The expenditure for the past year had been £63,-390 5s. 2d., being £41,987 9s. 3d. less than the receipts, leaving the society with a clear balance at the end of December, 1872, amounting to £158,313 12s. 1d. In the £63,390 expended during the past year only £6,000 had been expended in trade disputes, the other items consisting of payments for the various benefits to members, such as out of employment, sick, funeral, and superannuation money, &c. The following shows the total disbursements during the 22 years of the society's existence: -Paid to members out of employment, a very small proportion having been expended in trade disputes, £546,265; sick pay, £234,419; superannuation pay, £80,379; accident pay, £21,000; funeral money, £74,120; benevolent grants, £19,117; as sistance to other trades, £11,136; making a total expenditure of £986,436.
