

DAWSON HOSPITAL.

GENEROUS DONATIONS FOR THE
INSTITUTION AT THE YUKON
CAPITAL.

The Yukon Midnight Sun, Dawson City, July 11th, says: As all know, the hospital under the wise and generous management of Father Judd, has drawn no line of color, sect, creed or financial condition, against those who have applied for admission to its benefits. The poor man, in physical distress, has found in this institution excellent medical skill and the care of trained nurses without cost. The rich have had the same comforts and ministrations, but have been charged a reasonable fee for board, lodging and medical attendance. During the past winter one half or more of the patients were financially unable to contribute to the defrayment of the expense of which they are the cause.

It is therefore not to be wondered at that this institution is confronted by a large deficit. Its indebtedness is in the neighborhood of \$25,000, but Father Judd and his friends of the hospital have perfect faith in the generosity of Dawson's citizens to not only wipe out the present indebtedness, but to also stand ready to respond to the future needs of the institution.

D. W. Davis, collector of customs, and Mr. Wade, crown prosecutor, have been securing contributions for this purpose during the past few days. They have met with generous responses. The government takes the lead with a donation of \$5,000 appropriated from the fund accruing from the rental of the water front. The contributions by private parties so far are below:

These figures make in all a total of \$9,000, which has already been turned over to Father Judd to be used in paying hospital expenses. This week a paper will be circulated among all classes of business men and citizens, and we predict the required amount will be secured in short order.
