



another Party, that period shall be considered as a period of residence in Canada for that person as well as for that person's spouse and dependants who reside with him or her and who are not subject to the legislation of another Party by reason of employment; and

- (b) if a person is subject to the legislation of another Party during any period of residence in the territory of Canada, that period shall not be considered as a period of residence in Canada for that person and for that person's spouse and dependants who reside with him or her and who are not subject to the *Canada Pension Plan* or the comprehensive pension plan of a province of Canada by reason of employment.

Article 8

Creditable Periods under the Legislation of Jersey, Guernsey and Canada

- (1) If a person is not entitled to the payment of a benefit because he or she has not accumulated sufficient creditable periods under the legislation of a Party, the entitlement of that person to the payment of that benefit shall be determined by
