

- *Parental rights and responsibilities*
Adoption of language on balancing the rights, duties and responsibilities of parents with the rights and evolving capacities of children in matters relating to access to information, privacy and confidentiality.
- *Girls*
Agreement to call for the elimination of all forms of discrimination against girls and to ensure their equal access to education and training, nutrition and health care.
- *Equal inheritance rights for all children*
Statement on equality of succession and inheritance rights to eliminate obstacles to equality for girls.
- *Education*
Affirmation that literacy and education are fundamental to the achievement of equality; and agreement to Canadian proposals on training and life-long learning.
- *Gender analysis*
Call for a gender perspective to be reflected in policies and programs to ensure that governments take into consideration the different impact these policies and programs may have on men and women.
- *Integrating women's human rights throughout the UN system*
Agreement to require all UN bodies and specialized agencies to consider the "gender dimension" when formulating policies and programs.
- *Sexual orientation*
Statements by many countries, including Canada, that they interpreted the principle of non-discrimination to include sexual orientation. (Term "sexual orientation" not included in Beijing Platform for Action)
