the minister if he can advise the house when he is going to unpeg the Canadian dollar?

Hon. Walter L. Gordon (Minister of Finance): Mr. Speaker, as I said during the course of the election campaign, it is the responsibility of all hon. members of this house, including the hon. member who just asked this question, not to cast any doubts upon the strength or permanence of the dollar.

Mr. Remi Paul (Berthier-Maskinonge-Delanaudiere): I should like to direct a question to the Minister of Finance.

Can the minister inform the house about the pressure brought to bear by the American government in order to re-establish parity between the Canadian and the American dollar?

Mr. Gordon: Mr. Speaker, I would like to answer that question. Canada has a fixed exchange rate, and this government will do everything possible to see that that rate is held.

Mr. Kindi: In the event that it is not held, has the government taken into consideration any plans that will overcome the losses sustained by people who are now enjoying the exchange relationships that exist?

Mr. Gordon: So far as I am concerned, Mr. Speaker, that is a hypothetical question.
