Mr. H. Russell MacEwan (Pictou): Mr. Speaker, I have a question for the Minister of National Defence. In view of the proposal to keep United Nations troops in Cyprus for another three months at least, can the minister advise if it is the intention of the government to rotate the Canadian troops there completely; that is, replace the VanDoos, the R.C.D.'s and other supporting troops?

Hon. Paul Hellyer (Minister of National Defence): Mr. Speaker, as we have already announced, if the period is extended and if the Canadian contingent remain they will be rotated.

Hon. Gordon Churchill (Winnipeg South Centre): Mr. Speaker, could I ask a related question. What is the estimated cost of maintaining our forces in Cyprus? An estimate was given last March of \$2,600,000 for the three month period. Does that estimate hold for the succeeding three month period?

Mr. Hellyer: In reply to that question, Mr. Speaker, may I say I believe we gave a monthly figure for maintaining the force there, and I think it would still be valid.
