

The Lettish and Litva words for the cardinal points seem to have been adopted at a new place quite late, as the higher country; East rytai, west vakarai (Akars). This is nearly like Lettish, but north is shauri (Isaurians, or Servians) and south, pietos (Bets). Here Letts had north and south giesmels (Shimalx). The Letts call south the "day side" generally.

The words for night nyts nyx and day hemera seems to fit the Greeks in Macedonia, but it is too late to get words for day and night ^{there}. Hemera might also mean something else than nyx ^{to} run.

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
