KANSAS WEED USED IN SOAP

What has heretofore been considered a pest by ranchers in Western Kansas is now being cut and mareted for use in the manuacture of soap. It is a species of the Yucca, known locally as Spanish Bayonet, or soap weed, and spreads over large areas, killing other vegetation. Both the tops and roots are utilized by soap manufacturers, who pay about \$8 a ton for the plant at railway stations. After cutting, the weed is allowed to dry from 60 to 90 days, after which it is baled. Indian and Mexican women have long used this weed to make a decoction, soapy in character, used in washing their hair, for which purpose it is considered beneficial, as it contains no alkali.
