The Canadians, like their Southern neighbours, have acquired an energy from the war, which, like them, they will carry into all the operations of peace. To argue, that the Canadians, becaufe they were once indolent and poor, are never to become active and opulent, is to inful that the affairs of the would do not run continually in a progrefs; that children never become men ; that every people have not their beginning, their rife, and their decline. The hillorian will find no great difficulty, in pointing out the exact period, when each of the revolted Colonies exported a lefs quantity of wheat and flour than Canada actually fent out, as its furplus, in 1772. When the United States, in their fpirit of refentment, rather than retaliation, shall have withdrawn the competition of their civizens; when a conllant demand thall have operated as an encouragement to the manufacturing of wheat; then will Canada fupply both Newfoundland and the British West Indies with a fufficient quantity of flour, which when well packed keeps
