HAMILTON HAPPENINGS

MAST OF ICE-BOAT FALLS STRIKING SAILOR ON HEAD

Charles Cox Suffering From Concussion of the Brain—Street Car Hits Mrs. S. Broadhead.

HAMILTON, March 3.—Charles Cox, 29 years of age, of 214 Wellington-street, was taken to the City Hospital this afternoon, suffering from a concussion of the brain.

Mrs. Sarah Allan Broadhead, 19 Keith-street, was struck by a street car this afternoon at Avondale and Barton-streets.

Want Club Fee Reduced. It was also decided to try and have article 2, section 2, of the C. L. A. regulations amended so that the fee for clubs would not have to put up such a large fee, \$50, or the bond of \$200.
