In Kingston there are now three elevators with a combined capacity of over 1,500,000. All this, elevator capacity has been provided for the purpose of diverting to the St. Lawrence route a part of the grain trade which hitherto has been almost monopolized by the Erie Canal-for Parry Sound grain is put on barges at Coteau and taken through the Beauharnois and La-chine canals. 


