"STRAITON" SIR WILFRID LAURIER

Promises to Help Premier Ross "See Laurier Thru" by Winning West Petroboro and Going to Senate.

Petroboro, Oct. 20.—(Staff Special.)—An immense crowd thronged the rink tonight when Sir Wilfrid Laurier spoke to the electors of West Petroboro.

It was expected by some that Hon. J. R. Stratton would take the occasion of announcing his retirement from public life.

The World enquired from the minister what had changed his plans. "When I have anything to say, I'll say it," he replied, but he would not say that he did not contemplate an early retirement.

Among his friends here, that is the Stratton Conservatives, who are the Liberal provincial politicians and Conservative in Dominion politics.

Sir Wilfrid spoke of "my friend Stratton" in a manner which indicated that the provincial secretary is a force in the politics of this riding.

Major Roger, who presided, said the entire community, regardless of party, desired to pay their respects to a distinguished man.

From the ranks of the Liberal party in the legislature Premier Ross will require to draw three men to fill the portfolios to be vacated.

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Questioned by Auditor. Sir Wilfrid discussed the railway question, and concluded by predicting the triumph of Liberalism in Ontario.

If the investment was not a good one from the people's standpoint, the city would not be cautioned against it by the Consumers' Gas Company.

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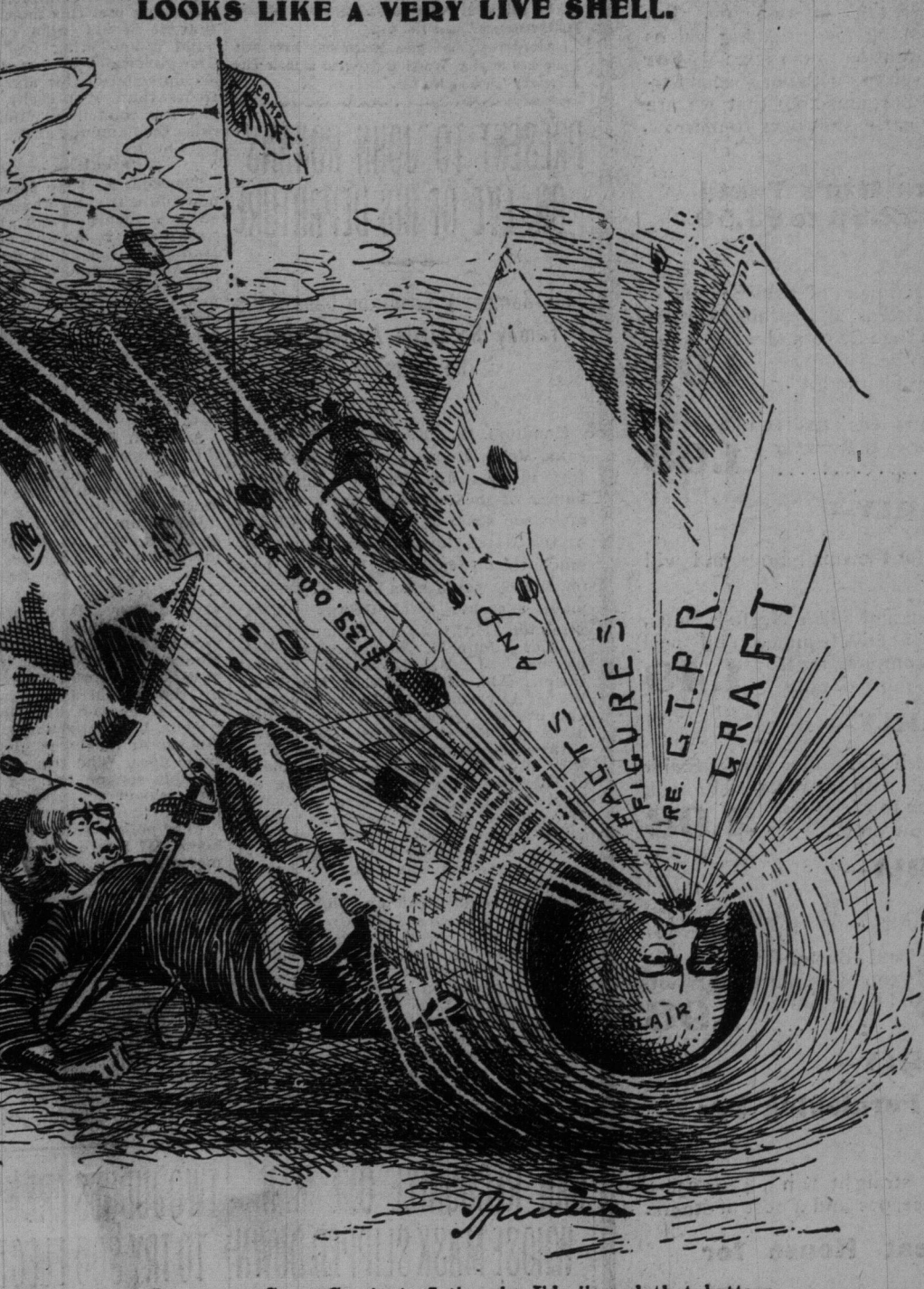
