LUNENBURG has sent \$87.05, which is a third more than last year.

From MAHONE BAY we regret to note that no return bas been made for 1866. From Maitland we have received \$105.00, which, the Missionary remarks, "is a considerable increase upon last year's contribution."

MANCHESTER has sent to the Society \$15.17.

Melford has sent \$31.10, which is a falling-off from last year. The Missionory remarks "that great exertions are making to build a parsonage, and that there has been more money raised for Church matters during the last twelve months than for many years put together before."

New Dublin has sent \$49.00, which is \$20.00 more than in 1865.

From New Ross a list amounting to \$43.00 has been received, which is at least a fourth more than in 1865 The Church people there, thou, h numer ous, are poor and scattered. It is at much cost of personal labor by the

The return from NewPORT and Walton is \$83.13, nearly a fourth more than in 1865.

PARRSBOROUGH has been omitted from the list of Local Committees.

PICTOU has sent \$91.47. The list was sent too late for the Report. return for last year was \$68.30.

PORT MEDWAY (formerly part of the Parish of Liverpool) appears for the first time, and has sent in a list amounting to \$43.32. From Pugwash we bave received \$73.38.

RAWDON has returned \$25.63, which is much less than in 1865.

SACKVILLE has sent \$28.87, a little more than in 1865.

From Shelburne we have received \$121.96. Last year the return was \$118.00. This parish is now contributing largely toward the support of an assistant-Missionary, and making excrtions to build a parsonage.

The Missionary at Ship Harbor has sent \$100.00, which is fully one-third more than in 1865.

STEWIACKE has sent \$26.36, which is much less than last year's contribution. From St. Margaret's Bay has been received \$71.13, which is more than twice the amount of last year.

From Sydney, C.B., has been sent a list amounting to \$137.37, being nearly twice the amount of last year. The interests of the Society appear to have received a fresh impulse during the past year.

Sydney Mines has sent in \$32.00, which, as the Missionary states, is some improvement on last year's return.

THREE FATHOM HARBOR appears for the first time on our lists, and has added \$48.00 to the income of the Society. This was formerly part of Dartmouth parish.

TRURO has sent in a list of \$142.55 which is \$50.00 more than the return of last year.

TUSKET, though now without a resident missionary, has, by the exertions of the Rector of Yarmouth, contributed \$25.00.
