HERMANN SAYS BALL PLAYERS WILL NOT STRIKE New York, Feb. 12.—There is not a doubt in my mind that the striking players will quit as soon as the time arrives to go south," said Hermann yesterday. "It will be shown in the near future that they have been badly misled. I have signed practically all of the Cincinnati Reds because I proved to them that they were in the wrong. Heinie Groh is holding out for a large salary, but I feel sure that he soon will come to his senses. When I secured Groh from the Giants his contract called for less than \$20,000 a year. I paid him \$40,000 in 1914 and subsequently he cut his terms to \$5,000, saying that he would sign regardless of the union's edict. But the Cincinnati club cannot afford to pay Groh more than \$4,000, and there the matter will stand indefinitely unless the player accepts our figure. "The strike is for salaries, nothing more, and I am in a position to furnish proof to that effect. On two occasions the union threatened to call a strike, but organized baseball capitulated. We do not intend to be forced into another compromising position this time. The union must be exterminated and we know a way to accomplish that end."

German School Boys' Amazing Prank. At Seiden, in Saxony, a wealthy farmer, celebrating his birthday, had baked a large quantity of cakes. The party was interrupted by the appearance of a taxi, from which a uniformed and bearded officer and a policeman emerged while two civilians remained inside.
