Mutt Was Race Dopester — Jeff  
Was Sheer Accident — Born in  
San Francisco in 1907

On November 16, 1907, in the busy little city of San Francisco, a great man was born. Unlike most great men, the fact of his greatness was known and recognized the day of his birth, and from that day to the present his sole object in life has been keeping people laughing. His name is A. Mutt; his "side-kick" is Jeff; his creator is "Bud" Fisher; and the trio are now appearing regularly in each issue of The Times.

Mr. Fisher was drawing for the San Francisco Chronicle at the time, and it was only after long months of coaxing that he succeeded in inducing that paper to let him run his comic strip. At last they gave the desired permission, and one morning A. Mutt appeared, giving "dope" on the races. He was an instantaneous hit.

"How did you happen to pick out the character of Mutt?" the writer asked Mr. Fisher one day.

"Before I started the comic, I used to go to the races pretty regularly, and I would see fellows bearing around among the hustlers, touts, the crans and bookmakers trying to pick up tips which would make them some money. None was a heavy better, but they all looked as if they needed the money to feed their families. They showed more anxiety over their picking bets than the big plunkers did."

"I decided to make one of these race track frequenters the character of my strip, and so I picked out a composite type. He had to be a weak guy, and I made A. Mutt with no chin. He must be money to get the feed bag news, which is the low down on the races, so Mr. Mutt had a long nose. Then he was tall and thin and angular so he could hustle."

Following his Betting Tips.

According to Mr. Fisher, the prototypes from which he had drawn the character of Mutt began to read him conscientiously every day to see what Mutt was going to do about betting, and followed suit. Fisher named real horses in real races at real odds in his comic, and he obtained his data from experts of his acquaintance. His tips were good, and Mutt at one time actually rolled up a fortune on paper. Fisher each night would take the odds for the races the next day and select a horse for Mutt to play. His choice soon began to affect the odds at the track, and the bookmakers would back down the price if they saw in the morning Chronicle that Mutt was playing Feedbag to win.

But the entry always received a big play, no matter what the price, for Fisher made it a point to give the readers as good knowledge as he could obtain.

If the horse had won on the preceding day, Mutt was prosperous in the paper on the following morning, and he announced on who he would stake his fortune that afternoon. If this horse lost, then Mutt was broke, and Fisher showed real genius in devising means for his character to obtain money to begin all over again. The character parlayed fifty cents into thousands of dollars and then lost it all on one smash. This Mutt at the races had, San Francisco by the ears.

Jeff was an Accident.

Jeff's introduction was by accident, and is a good story in itself. At one stage of his meteoric career on the track, Mutt became disgusted with the odds and the prices and the bets which the bookmakers would accept. He decided to change his headquarters to an insane asylum, where he could lay any price he wanted on any horse and bet as much as he pleased, and none of the regular boarders at the asylum would complain. It gave Fisher a wide range for his humor.

The scheme worked out to Mutt's entire satisfaction, although daily he was bothered by "nuts." One morning a man interrupted Mutt while he was studying the dope sheet and told him he was William Shakespeare, the Shakespeare of Stratford-on-Avon. This did not thrill Mutt.

"Go away, Shakes," remarked Mutt, "and don't bother me. I've the dope on a winner."

The following day Fisher had Napoleon of the nut factory commit with Mutt. This great at the asylum where Mr. Nutt was making all his imaginary money was interested in military affairs, and believed he was the Great Emperor in all his glory. He was, however, weak on geography. He approached Mutt in the daily strip and said:

"I have to report I have just taken Vicksburg."

"Well, put it back and don't bother me," promptly replied Mutt.

First Time Jeff "Got His."

Various strange characters entered the strip day by day. One morning a funny little fellow came along wearing boxing gloves.

"Who are you?" asked Mutt.

"I'm James J. Jeffries," replied the newcomer, "and I want to fight you." He wanted Mutt to do the boxing gloves, but the tall fellow was too busy with his inevitable racing sheets, so the last picture of the strip showed James J. Jeffries down on the floor with Mutt's foot in his face and the owner of the foot quietly studying the form card. It was the first time Jeff "got his," but he was destined to receive it frequently in the years to come.

"Did Jeff continue in the pictures daily, from the time Mutt found him in the insane asylum," asked the writer.

"No, he didn't get a steady job for some time after that. He obtained his permanent place in the comic during the graft investigation in San Francisco. After I took Mutt out of the asylum, Jeff went back on the shelf with Shakespeare and Napoleon and all the other 'nuts.' When I began to draw cartoons on the graft case, I brought Jeff back into the pictures. The little fellow came out of the asylum in order to sympathize with Rudolph Spreckels because he said Spreckels was crazier than he was. He complained that he should not be kept in the asylum under those circumstances. Jeff has been in the daily pictures regularly ever since except occasionally when Mutt appears alone. Jeff has also starred alone in some strips."

So that is how little Jeff broke into the Big League of cartoon characters.
