## PINDER ATTACKS HON. MR. McLEOD

Bitter Reply to Charges Against Himself

Says Former Colleague Inspired Investigation-Talks of "Political Parisites' - Public Accounts Chairmanship

Fredericton, March 22-A sensational attack upon his former colleague, and former provincial secretary, Hon. H. F. McLeod, was made in the legislature McLeod, was made in the legislature this evening by James K. Pinder, M.P.P. His attack was the more remarkable because he was the man who nominated Mr. McLeod for the dominion parliament. Mr. Pinder read a carefully prepared statement criticisizing the report submitted by Commissioner Pringle and the motives which had inspired the investigation.

Later in the evening Mr. Pinder referred to the newspaper discussion of his position as chairman of the public accounts committee, and said that he was willing to resign that position, as he had not asked for it and had made no threats of what he would do if it were not given to him. He did not refer to the threats made his friends.

He complained that the Liberals had not all been dismissed, and they were responsible for the trouble of the government. He was still a Conservative and ready to defend the party at any time, but with the Liberals tacked on it was a different proposition.

In his statement regarding the Southampton Railway inquiry, he said:

"I claim, and I say this advisedly and without hesitation, that the course of this inquiry was directed or influenced by a small group of political parisites, led by the present member for this county at Oltawa. With many others in this county, I had opposed that honorable gentleman's attempt to ride roughshod over the rank and file of the Conservative party.
