6 NEW ATTORNEYS ADMITTED TO BAR

Chief Justice Hazen Administers Oath in Fredericton Court Today

FREDERICTON, N. B., Nov. 19.—Six attorneys, including one young woman, were admitted and sworn as barristers of the Supreme Court of New Brunswick before the Court of Appeal this morning.

The six new barristers were admitted on the motion of J. J. P. Winslow, K. C., acting on behalf of the council of the New Brunswick Bar Association. They are: Miss Margaret M. Sin, of Montreal; Harry T. Feily and Henry C. Friel, of Moncton; J. Thomas Troy, of Chatham; Paul Barry and A. H. L. Slipp, of Fredericton.

The new barristers were congratulated by Chief Justice Sir Douglas Hazen after the oaths had been administered. The Chief Justice extended his wishes for successful careers as barristers of the court.

ANCIENT RELICS FOUND.

NAPLES, Italy, Nov. 19.—Roman tombs containing almost pulverized bones and articles dating back three centuries before Christ have been discovered near Caserta. Among the articles found were terra cotta vases, wine jars, artistically decorated, dishes and brass Roman lamps. The discoveries were made by workmen excavating for the construction of the direct Rome to Naples railway.
