British Government Doomed To Defeat Is General Opinion

WORLD SERIES ON; SCANDAL GROWS

GENERAL ELECTION DURING NOVEMBER IS NOW INEVITABLE

Several Ways Open to the Premier All Lead to This Conclusion.

LABOR OPTIMISTIC Some Members Welcome Ballot, Look for Gain of Sixty Seats.

BY LLOYD ALLEN (United Press Staff Cor.) London, Oct. 3.—Outgoing trains from London today were crowded with members of Parliament, hurrying home to their constituencies to start oratorical fireworks in preparation for a general election.

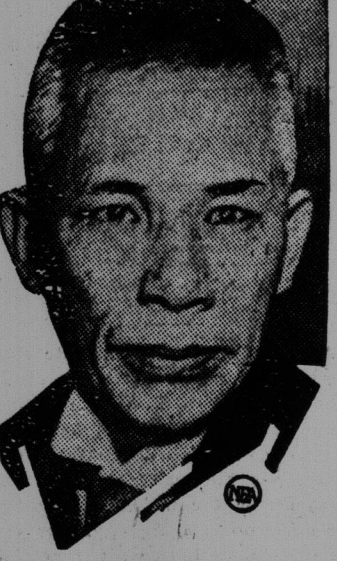
The government is apparently resigned to defeat, when the Commons resumes its regular session, the last of this month, but its opponents will make a first onslaught next week.

Prime Minister MacDonald, facing the crisis of his career, is consulting with his colleagues as to the best method of lessening the blow, although government spokesmen profess to welcome a general election and claim Labor will gain 60 seats.

An attack will be launched at the special session which is to be resumed next Wednesday, the subject of a Conservative motion of censure being drawn by the Attorney General of the prosecution of a Communist editor for sedition.

If the Government weathers this storm, and it will depend upon Macdonald's play his cards, defeat later on seems inevitable and preparations are under way for an election in November.

MONTREAL LIQUOR CONCERN MANAGER SUED FOR \$100,000

Action Brought by Myer Rosenthal in Connection With Lutzen Case.

SAYS FALSE CHARGE Defendant's Name Resembles That Mentioned in Case Against Phaff.

New York, Oct. 3.—Alec Adelman, president of the Sunset Wine and Spirit Company of Montreal, has been sued for \$100,000 damages in the Supreme Court here by Myer Rosenthal, formerly connected with the company, who says that Adelman and a brother, Norman, falsely charged him with the piracy of the schooner Lutzen.

Phaff, arrested for the piracy of the French steamer Mulhouse, which was loaded with 22,000 cases of whiskey off the Canadian coast last July, has refused to discuss the man named "Adelman" mentioned in the affidavit filed in the French court.
