

New York, Oct. 3—With 300,000 men and women out of employment in New York at the present time the city is facing a serious economic situation, according to John Suilivan, director of the New York City. Bureau of Industrial Ald. And what makes the situation even more significant, said Mr. Suilivan, is the fact that about 60 per cent. of the unemployed are union members. "Not since the fall of 1921, which preceded an unusually hard winter, have there been so many unemployed," he said. "In normal times our bureau places about 125 men daily. At present we are placing only about 60 or 65 men a day. These applications, it must be remembered, are mostly non-union men. The agencies maintained by the various unions also are being besleged by hundreds of seekers for work." Demands Federal Probe.

Who Is Responsible?
