Attractive prices seem to offer little incentive, people everywhere being of the opinion that money in hand at this time is worth more than coal in the basement. Shipment of coal at the present time, they point out, would not only keep the mines working toward the limit of the capacity, but would also assist the railways and relieve much of the congestion that is bound to be the outcome of this lack of coal buying.
