NELLIE GILL PLAYERS AT OPERA HOUSE OPEN WITH SUCCESS

Paid in Full is Well Presented and Well Received

The Nellie Gill Players opened a ten days' engagement at the Opera House last night with the presentation of the drama *Paid in Full*.
