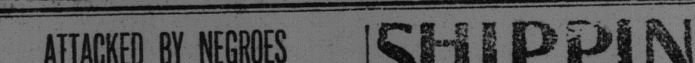

La MARQUISE de FONTENAY

Dom Miguel's American Wife Was Not Invited to Wedding—A King's Sad State—Prince of Bourbon's Troubles

So much has been made, by the friends and relatives of the former Miss Anita Stewart, of the illustrations of her relationship which she had formed through her marriage to Dom Miguel, the ruler of Portugal, and to the wedding of Prince Zita of Parma-Bourbon to the young Archduke Charles Francis, destined to become one day the ruler of the dual empire.

Dom Miguel, who is now connected with his stockholding firm in London, a first cousin of the bride, and both the widowed Duchess of Parma, mother of the bride, and also the Archduchess Maria Theresa, Austria, are his aunts. In fact, the principal relatives of all the principal persons, that have taken place since he became the husband of Miss Anita Stewart.

When, however, he led her to the altar in Scotland, he was obliged to surrender all his rights and prerogatives as a royal personage. This act of his was a great humiliation. But the neglect to effect a full settlement of his liabilities in Austria, either by his mother-in-law or himself, and the further embitterment of his marriage and has moreover rendered notorious to him in Austria and Hungary altogether.

The fact of the matter is that his debts in Austria have not been settled, either at the court of Vienna or to the large circle of his royal and imperial creditors in Austria. Furthermore, at his first wife's wedding last week to Prince Zita, their first cousin, they were not invited to the feast at which the principal guests was the aged emperor.

K—No Triumph
Cannon fire, church bells ring merrily, and the streets and houses are adorned with greenery and bunting, the inhabitants on holiday attire, the music of military bands fills the air, and troops line the streets, when a sovereign makes his first entry into his capital after his accession to the throne.

Pathetic by way of contrast was the secret and almost unceremonious arrival of Grand Duke William of Luxembourg in his dominions and in his principal city for the first time since his accession to the throne in 1905, but was so ill at the time that it was impossible to move him from his castle of Hohenburg, near Bavaria. There he remained, his departure for Luxembourg being put off month by month and year by year. In vain hope that there might be an improvement in his condition. This expectation has already been disappointed, and the possibility of any amelioration of his state which is one of almost complete paralysis, is almost nil.

It will be recalled that when the king and queen were on their honeymoon, he was invited to the palace of Cologneberg, on the bank of the Rhine. It is because it is considered best, from a dynastic point of view, that when the end comes he should be buried in the same place as his people; also because the inhabitants of Luxembourg wish to have the grand-duchess and her young son, the present sovereign, to be buried in the same place as their ancestor.
