A Trip to Bottom of Sea in Diving

Dress Another of English Girl's

Experiences—Anthony Hope

as Barrie's Guest at Castle in

Hebrides

(Times' Special Correspondence)

London, Sept. 14.—That must venture

some of women writers, Beatrice Grim-

shaw, who gave us "When the Red Gods

Call," has been having some more ad-

ventures. Incidentally she has a new

novel ready for publication, and the ad-

ventures tell her while in quest of ma-

terial therefor—but never mind the book

now. Miss Grimshaw has sought trouble

in most of the out-of-the-way corners of

this planet—in Fiji, New Guinea, Ceylon,

and the Australian "bush," to name only

a few—she has left her native Ireland,

and set out on her wanderings—and she

seems to like best of all to be in places

where she stands a good chance of being

eaten.

The news that an English missionary

named Chalmers had furnished a feast for

the inhabitants of the island of Goro,

in the Gulf of Papua, and that sev-

eral other foreigners had been killed and

eaten there, had the same effect on her

that an unusually attractive circular from

a tourist agency has on the ordinary wo-

man, and she packed her trunk and set

out for the island forthwith.

Here is an extract from a letter which

she wrote to a friend in London, who

showed it to me.

"The natives were extremely excited and

tremulous. When I and two others were in

one of the houses they came and held up

a joint of cooked human flesh before me,

saying, 'I looked here, and I saw only

wolves.' I think it was ribs. There was also

a canoe full of skulls in the river and

many skulls in the houses. They said

that the system of cannibalism was the

most civilized of the natives, and that

which was the method of burial, and some

strange images."

While she was risking her life among

the Fijians, she had camped out for the

night with some native women, and this

she said:

"One young woman, shoe-brush-haired,

wild-eyed and long of tooth, even going

to arm in a passion of delight, even going

so far as to set her teeth gently in the

flesh, and exclaim longingly, 'Vivaka na

baba!' (What good food!) I knew that

she was too young to have been a cannibal

and that her exclamation was only a com-

pliment—somewhat half-hearted, it is true,

—to my British skin, but the remark was

interesting as an unconscious outbreak of

heresy."

One can only conclude, after reading her

freedom and never having been let-

tered that the capacity for fear has been

left out of Miss Grimshaw's composition.

Once, for example, she went to a

diver's dress among pearl shell beds off

Thursday Island. The place swarmed with

sharks and alligators, but the author

was told these could be scared off by lo-

cating the wrist of the dress so as to let

some air out. "I chanced it," she says,

"and came up all right after a good walk

at the bottom on a coral reef. It was most
