


SIXTH WITNESS - Questions from the Officiating Officer.

- Q.4 Is there any order prohibiting the use of W.D. vehicles to carry military personnel to public houses?
A.4 Yes, MT Drivers Regulations, para. 44b, sub-para. 4, specifically prohibits the use of vehicles for this purpose.
- Q.5 That Section deals with recreational transport does it not?
A.5 Yes.
- Q.6 Is Vehicle CZ-4209900 authorised for recreational use at any time?
A.6 No.


The Accused declines to cross-examine.


