The accused, after being duly cautioned in accordance with rules of Proceedure 4 (E), states (not Sworn) :

" I did not go up to the petrol store to steal petrol. It isn't reasonable to think that a man would go there to steal at four o o'clock in the afternoon. I was to go on guard at 4.45.F.M. that day Priday, 6 Dec. 40 I had shaved and cleaned my equipment preparatory to going on guard. I had some spare time around 3.30 P.M. and I was cleaning up my barber tools. I needed keresene to clean my clipper plates, and I went to the petrol stores to get it. I didn't go to the Transport Office to ask rermission because I expected to find someone. at the stores. When I got there, there was nobody at the store and the window was broken. The glass had been gracked for some time. This day I found about four-fifths of the glass smashed out of the frame. I climbed in through the window. I don't remember having taken any glass out of the frame . My purpose in enetering was to get a little keresene , which I was suge was kept there, since I had got it there before, I didn't know it. was the petrol store, since we had got our petrol from the pumps at a garage on the road to Leatherhead. When I got inside I started looking for keresene, shifting the petrol tins about and while I was doing this Mulholland came to the window. I was not getting ready to leave the petrol store when he Came, I was not kneeling on the table, though I was probably standing beside it, with petrol tins in my hands, which were empty, and which I was shifting in my search for kerosene. Mulholland told me to hand him a full tin from the other sideeof the room. I did this. Then L/Cpl. Castonguay arrived.

I certify that the forgoing evidence consisting of four pages was taken down by me in writing in the prescense and hearing of the accused and rules of proceedure 4 (G), (B), (E) and (F) have been
