I also beg to inform you that all of Tps 14, & 15, Range 4, East ~~which~~ included within the reserve, has been already surveyed, but the posts, like those along the river belt have disappeared long ago, as they were only poplar, but the mounds in some cases can still be found.

B. Dept
The Chief does not think for a moment that the survey should be paid for out of the funds of the Band, as he declares that it was a distinct understanding with the Government that when it was the desire of the Indians to have the reserve surveyed or sub. divided, that the Department would have it done.

I would suggest that when the outer part of the Reserve is surveyed that a post be placed in the center of each section, as well as at the corners, and half miles, as there then would be no difficulty in marking out the legal subdivisions of the sections.
