U BOATS ORDERED 9 ALLIED AIRSHIPS OBSERVE PRIZE LAW WRECKED BY HUNS

Berlin will indemnify Owners of Dutch Steamer if U Boat Commander Broke the Law

The Hague, Netherlands, Oct. 13, via London—The Dutch government today received from the German legation a statement to the effect that implicit instructions had been given to the commanders of German submarines to sink neutral steamships in no case unless the vessels could be destroyed in accordance with the German prize law. Therefore it was considered extremely unlikely that the captain of the Bloomer-ship which sank the steamship, as reported, that he would send to the bottom every ship which otherwise might touch a British port. Such a statement, it was pointed out, would have been completely opposed to the orders given to the commander. The government also was informed that should it be proved the Bloomer-ship's sinking was not in accordance with German prize law, Germany would grant indemnity for the vessel and cargo without submitting the matter to a German prize court.

THE CREW SAVED.

News was received at New York on October 11 by wireless of the rescue of five men believed to be from the schooner T W Dunn by the steamship El Rio of the Southern Pacific Steamship Co., about 250 miles east of Savannah, Ga. The message from the El Rio said she had picked up the crew of the S S Dunn, and that the vessel was waterlogged. The shipwrecked crew is being taken to Galveston, Texas. The T W Dunn sailed from New Orleans Sept 10 for Barcelona.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$50 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning a vested patent, also 30 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homesteaded land may take a purchase homestead. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 30 acres and erect a house worth \$50. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land.
