

## MANUFACTURERS WILL MEET HERE MAY 30

Annual Meeting of Maritime Branch—Busy Day Planned for Delegates.

A meeting of the executive of the Maritime Branch of the Canadian Manufacturers Association will be held yesterday at the Board of Trade rooms to complete arrangements for the annual meeting which will be held here May 30. From advices received the attendance will be large, as manufacturers from all parts of the Maritime Provinces have signified their intention of being present.

The delegates will spend a busy day. In the morning the first thing will be a trip to some of the industrial plants of the city. At 10.30 the first business session will be held. Lunch will be served at the Manor House, after which the delegates will be given an automobile trip around the city and the last business session will be held at 3.30. In the evening Prof. Sexton, Dominion Vocational officer, will deliver an address on the need of technical education in order to provide better trained material for the needs of the manufacturing world to enable them to compete in the world markets.

The entire session will be devoted particularly to the discussion of problems which must be faced on the conclusion of the war and it is hoped the gathering will be helpful to all those in attendance.

The business sessions will be held in the Board of Trade rooms and the hall for the evening meeting will be announced later.


