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WEIRMEN HOLD **ANNUAL MEETING**

Have Placed a Minimum Price of \$20 Per Hoghead for Fish This Season.

St. George, March 28.—The annual meeting of the Weirmen's Union was held in the Imperial Theatre this afternoon. There was a large attendance although the "flu" epidemic prevented many from being present. However it was an enthusiastic meeting. The chair was taken by President Fraulley at 3 p. m., Oscar Hanson secretary.

Minutes of last meeting were read and approved.

The report of the secretary-treasurer was read showing a balance of \$389.25 on hand at date. Some discussion then took place in regard to the membership fee. It was finally moved, seconded and carried, that the annual fee be \$1.00 and a \$2.00 assess ment on each weir. The secretary then read a resolution which had been passed at the meeting of the executive of the Maine Weirmen's Association, the substance of which was as follows: That \$20 per hoghead be the lowest price accepted for sardines for the present season.

It was moved by John Catherine, and seconded by Harry Belyea, that the recommendation be adopted by this meeting. An animated discussion then took place, those participating being Alonzo Calder, John Catherine, M. N. Cockburn, George M. Byron, Charles Johnson, George Ellis, Mr. Cassidy and Mr. Wallace.

The consensus of opinion was in favor of the resolution.

Some of the weirmen from Mac's Bay, however, objected as they had had a meeting of their executive which passed a resolution in favor of a flat rate of \$25.00 per hoghead.

Telegrams were read by the president from Mr. Ingalis of Grand Manan and also from some weir-owners in St. Andrews expressing regret at their inability to be present at the meeting, and asked that no change be made in the price of fish.

Election of officers was next proceeded with. The following were elected for the ensuing year: George E. Fraulley, president; Harry Belyea, vice-president; Oscar Hanson, secretary-treasurer, members of the executive to be left in the hands of the various sections at meetings to be held by them.

The question of salary for the secretary was then discussed. It was finally agreed that Mr. Hanson be paid \$100 per month and expenses, he to visit the different sections of the association, thus keeping in touch with the weirmen and adding new members whenever possible.

The meeting then adjourned.
