For regulating and establishing the CURRENCY of the PROVINCE.

By His Excellency JAMES MURRAY, E/q; Captain-General and Governor in Chief, in and over the Province of QUEBEC, and of the Territories depending thereon in America, Vice-Admiral of the Same, Governor of the Town of Quebec, and Colonel-Commandant of the Second Battalion of the Royal American Regiment of Foot, &c. &c. In Council, this 14th Day of September, in the Fourth Year of His Majefty's Reign, Annoque Domini, 1764.

HEREAS His Moft Sacred Majefty, by His Inftructions to His Excellency, bearing Date at St. James's, the Seventh Day of December, One Thoufand Seven Hundred and Sixty-Three, hath been pleafed to authorife and empower His faid Excellency, with the Advice and Affiftance of His Majefty's Council, to make Rules and Regulations, and Ordinances, for the better Ordering and well Governing of this His Province of Quebec: And whereas it is highly expedient and neceffary, to fix a certain Value upon every Species of Coin now in this Colony, and to afcertain the Currency thereof throughout the whole Province, upon One certain and uniform Plan; and having maturely confidered the feveral Currencies which prevail at this Time in the different Colonies and Provinces upon this Continent, as likewife the Eafe and Convenience of His Majefty's good Subjects of the Province of Quebec; His Excellency the Governor, by and with the Advice and Affiftance of His Majefty's Council, and by Virtue of the Power and Authority to him given by His Majefty's Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of Great-Britain, hath thought fit to Ordain and Declare; and His faid Excellency the Governor, by and with the Advice and Affiftance aforefaid, Doth bereby Ordain and Declare, That from and after the Firft Day of January, One Thoufand Seven Hundred and Sixty-Five, The following Species of Coins thall pafs current throughout this whole Province, at and after the feveral Rates herein mentioned, viz.

And it is bereby further Ordained and Declared, That from and after the faid First Day of January, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty-Five, the above Species of Coins, or any
