An Act to amend the Act to regulate the culling and measurement of Timber.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend in the manner herein- Preamble.

after mentioned the Act of the Legislature of this Province, passed in the eighth year of Her Majesty's Reign, and intituled, "*An Act to regulate the culling and measurement of Timber,* 8 Vict. c. 49.
5 "*masts, spars, deals, staves, and other articles of a like nature,*
"*and to repeal a certain Act therein mentioned,*" and to prevent the employment of incompetent persons to perform the duties assigned to cullers in and by the said Act; Be it therefore enacted, &c.,

10 That in the measurement of Timber, it shall be the duty of the Culler employed for that purpose, to measure not only the girth of each piece of Timber, but also to measure, personally, with the aid of one competent assistant, the length of each piece of Timber, in all cases where such measurement shall be practicable with the
15 aid of only one assistant; and in the event of any case arising in which, in the opinion of the Supervisor of Cullers or his Deputy, such measurement cannot be effected with the aid of one assistant only, then it shall be lawful for such Culler to employ an additional competent assistant for that purpose, who, as well as the assistant
20 first above mentioned, shall be approved of by the said Supervisor of Cullers or his Deputy.

Cullers to measure the length as well as the girth of Timber.

Additional assistant allowed when necessary.
