CAP. XLVIII.

An Act to permit Rum and other Spirits, the Produce sof the British Colonies in the West Indies, to be imported into Lower Canada from Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, and the Mands of Cape Breton, Prince Edward, and Newfoundland.

[31st May 1811.]

THEREAS it is expedient under certain Regulations to permit Rum and other Spirits, the Produce or Manufacture of His Majesty's Sugar Colonies in the West Indies to be imported into Lower Canada, from any of the Provinces, of Neva Scotia and New Brunfwick, the Island of Cape Breton, Prince Edward's Island, and the Island of Newfoundland, on: Payment of the same Rate of Duty as if the same had Abeen imported directly from any of His Majesty's faid Sugar Colonies in sthe iWest Indies; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Maeferty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this Act, 'Rum may be any Rum or other Spirits, being the Produce or Manufacture of any of His imported "Majesty's Sugar Colonies in the West Indies, legally and directly imported from certain provinces or Hands in North America, from Provinces into any or either of the faid Provinces or Illands in North America, from into Canada. the faid Sugar Colonies or from the Island of Bermuda, may be exported from any or either of the faid Provinces or Islands to the Province of Lower Canada, and landed and admitted to an Entry upon the Paymentof the same Rate of Duty as if the same had been imported directly from any of His Majesty's Sugar Colonies.
