come to Canada. The Government sent me to England last year as a special representative, to see if it were possible to secure Imperial legislation in accordance with the suggestion which this report contains. I am glad to be able to let you know that the British Parliament at its last session passed the measure which we desired. These documents I am sending you, partly because I hope they may be of interest to you, and also partly as an explanation of why it seems impossible for me to ever find time to complete my thesis for the Ph.D. When President Eliot was here some weeks ago I told him that if I could find the time I would write a thesis on the history of the labour movement in Canada. This I believe I could do in a short space of time, if I could ever see the allotted space ahead. It is however, I fear, something like a mirage in the desert-- one no sooner approaches it than it disappears.

I am pleased to hear that you have quite regained your former strength. I hope you may long continue to be well.
