We beg to advise you that our firm has been consulted by Mr. B. J. O'Reilly with reference to the situation wich at present exists adjoining his property on the Assimiboine river.

As you are no doubt aware the flow of the River at this place has been deflected and the sewerage is being emptied into the ground at this place and is creating a serious nuisarce and menace to health at this point.

Mr. O'Reilly realizes that it is a serious matter for the City as well but in this connection we would like to point out that for several years Mr. O'Reilly has repeatedly drawn the attention of members of the City Council to the state of affairs which existed there and further pointed out that the present condition of affairs might some day exist and that they should take steps than to make certain that it could not possibly come about but they have chosen to ignore it, and for this reason Mr. O'Feilly insists now that some action be immediately taken by the City to eliminate the trouble.
