Liberal Party were entitled to fail. On two occasions, in the presence of a relatively full House, in the years of the King Administration 1921-5, I challenged any member of the Government to get up and say that if he could enact the old Reciprocity Treaty in Canada now he would do so. Not one of them rose. That is on record in Hansard.

This man Pearson I do not know, but he seems to be quite a talker. When he proclaimed that the right economic policy for Canada was a "blend" between Government operation and private enterprise he put himself beyond the pale with me.
