In the matter of social reform, Liberal governments have not followed in the federal field any policy of laissesfaire. The policy has been the direct opposite. The Department of Lebour is a witness to the concern of the Liberal party for the well-being of Labour. It was a Liberal creation. The Labour Gazette, which has been published from month to month over a period now of 54 years, and which has been an instrument of investigation and information with respect to all phases of industrial conditions, was the creation of a Liberal administration. The annual reports and the special reports of the Department of Labour are all in the nature of state intervention in industrial problems. They were initiated by a Liberal government and developed under Liberal administrations on a scale far and away beyond anything attempted under other governments. Investigations into industrial conditions demanding reform have been a prominent feature of all Liberal administrations since Sir Wilfrid Laurier's government came into office in 1896.
