 charge you \$1.⁰⁰ for forwarding
 the assignment to the Head
 Office; that he can prove
 that he did not, by several
 witnesses, who were in the Office
 at the time.

I may add that Mr.
 Miller wrote to the Depart-
 ment on the 28th February,
 relative to the question whether
 the Jay Deed in favor of
 H. J. Flinton should be recognized,
 and it will be submitted to
 the Ordnance Law Department
 for opinion.
