Sir,-

With reference to your letter of the 22nd ultimo, I beg to say that the Department approves of you purchasing the undermentioned outfit for Sam White Cap, an ex-pupil of the Qu'Appelle Industrial School, viz. -

A yoke of steers, at an approximate cost of.....	\$110.00
1 set harness.....	13.50
1 plough.....	28.00
1 set whiffletrees.....	4.00
<u>Total.....</u>	<u>\$155.50</u>

Sam White Cap should sign an agreement to repay the cost over \$125.00 to the Department. Forms of agreement are enclosed herewith for signature by him, one copy of which should be returned to the Department.

It is regretted that assistance cannot be extended to the other boys mentioned in your letter. They are not eligible for ex-pupil grants, owing to the fact that they have been too long out of school. I may say that the provision which you made in your estimates for 1915-1916 for expupils of your agency was not considered by the Department when the estimates were being framed for the House. I may also state that the funds at the disposal of the Department for assistance to ex-pupils
