Dear Sir,-

In reply to your letter of the 21st ultimo, in regard to application of Mr. G. A. Robinson to prospect and mine on Kanaka Bar Indian reserve, I beg to say that both the application of Mr. Robinson for mineral on Indian Reserve No. 2, and the application of Mr. McKinnon for mineral rights on Kanaka Bar Reserve No. 4 will be dealt with as soon as the regulations have been established by Order in Council as to granting of surface rights.

I may say that Mr. McKinnon's application was first received for mining rights on Kanaka Bar No. 4, although incorrectly represented by the local Indian Agent as being an application on Indian Reserve No. 2.

As soon as the regulations are passed, the application of Mr. Robinson, being the first for mining rights on Reserve No. 2, will be given due consideration.
